IPEX prioritizes the highest standards of quality and safety for our products. However, there are instances where other uncertified and/or fraudulently certified products can appear in the market. These products either have fraudulent certification markings or no markings at all. This bulletin aims to reinforce the critical significance of electrical safety standards and guide readers in identifying and selecting compliant products.

Uncertified or fraudulently certified electrical conduit and fittings may not have been tested to meet regulatory standards and may as a result pose significant safety hazards such as electrical fires or shocks, which could endanger users.

Protect Yourself:

1. Check for official certification marks from recognized authorities like CSA, UL, or NSF.
2. Product markings should include the name or designation of the manufacturer.
3. Beware of labeling inconsistencies, typos, or untraceable manufacturers or certification records.
4. If unable to verify the listing, contact the applicable certification agency to confirm the authenticity of the certification.
5. If the product is confirmed to be uncertified or unauthentic, please report this to the local or provincial electrical safety association such as the ESA in Ontario.
